## Introduction

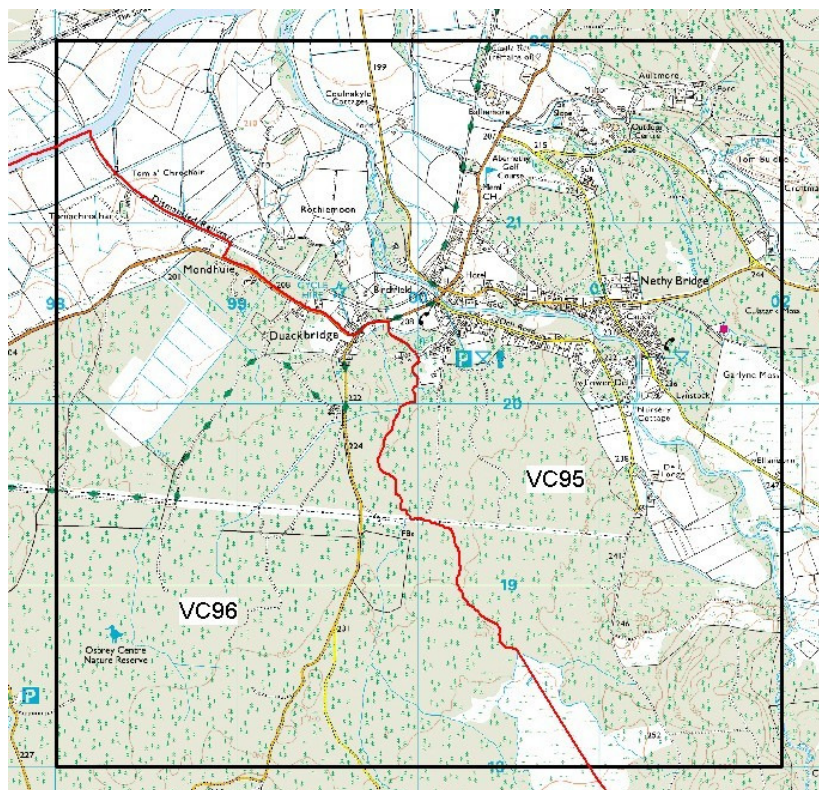
This checklist includes all species and hybrid vascular plants – flowers, grasses, sedges, rushes, ferns and their allies, and all tree species, recorded “in the wild” from the Nethy Bridge area. All species, whether native or alien, except those deliberately planted in gardens or amenity areas, are included. Except where necessary to clarify which plant is meant, or where current botanical thinking indicates they are separate species, sub-species and varieties are not listed.

The checklist is based on records collected and collated (from a wide variety of sources) by the BSBI (Botanical Society of the British Isles) County Recorders. Records from the Abernethy National Nature Reserve were contributed by RSPB.

The authors hope that this checklist, by narrowing down the likely possibilities, will be of assistance when identifying wild plants in the Nethy Bridge area. We also hope it will encourage people, local residents and visitors alike, to take an interest in the local flora. A checklist such as this could not be written if it were not for numerous individuals, over many years, sending in records of the plants they saw. Below, we give some guidance on how to submit records of plants.

## Checklist area

The area covered by this checklist is shown on the map below, and covers exactly 16 km<sup>2</sup>. Field botanists, and many other naturalists make reference to “vice-counties” (vc). The checklist area is divided in two by the boundary between vc95 (Moray) to the north-east and vc96 (Easternness) to the south-west. This is shown on the map as a red line.

## The Flora

Within this area, 478 species and hybrids have been recorded, of which 338 (71%) are native to the local area. A further 33 (7%) are long established aliens in Britain, while the remaining 107 (22%) are more recent introductions. A few of this latter group are so well established that they might be mistaken for native plants, eg. the umbellifer *Myrrhis odorata* (Sweet Cicely) and the yellow flowered *Doronicum pardalianches* (Leopard's-bane).

The native plants, along with many widespread species, include some that are nationally scarce, northern in distribution or are declining. These include such species as *Gnaphalium sylvaticum* (Heath Cudweed), *Goodyera repens* (Creeping Lady's-tresses), *Lycopodium annotinum* (Interrupted Clubmoss), *Pyrola minor* (Common Wintergreen) and *Viola canina* (Heath Dog-violet).

## The Checklist

This includes the following information:

- Species
  - The scientific name as used in Stace, C.A. (1997). *New Flora of the British Isles. 2<sup>nd</sup> edition. CUP, Cambridge*
  - The common name
- The year of the most recent record within the area covered by the checklist
- Whether native to the area or an alien. Two categories of alien species are given:
  - *Archaeophyte* - an alien species, maintaining itself from year to year by self-seeding or by vegetative spread, present in the wild in Britain before AD 1500
  - *Neophyte* - an alien species that first appeared in the wild in Britain after AD 1500
- If the species has a national conservation status this is listed under the following categories:
  - Threatened species, listed in Cheffings, C. and Farrell, L. (Eds.) (2005). *The Vascular Plant Red Data List for Great Britain. JNCC.*
  - Nationally Scarce (NSc). Recorded from 16 – 100 hectads (10 x 10km grid squares) in GB post 1987. Listed by the JNCC Species Status Assessment project (<http://www.jncc.gov.uk/page-3352>).
  - Species on the Scottish Biodiversity List
  - UK Biodiversity Action Plan species

## Plant recording

Any records of plants found “in the wild” around Nethy Bridge would be gratefully received (see contact details below). However, the value of these records will be maximised if the following guidelines are followed.

- What? Name the species. Scientific name is best, but common names are fine if unambiguous. If in doubt give both, and it is helpful to say which reference book(s) your names come from.
- Where? Give “Site” and OS grid reference. The minimum preferred resolution for all records is a 6 figure grid reference (ideally taken with a hand held GPS). If this is not possible, a 1km square (as shown on all OS maps). For more notable species, if a hand-held GPS unit is available, an 8-figure grid reference is the ideal. Remember, a grid reference refers to a square and the plants must have been seen within that square. Please do not use grid references for the centre of large sites, or combine species seen in adjacent squares into one list.
- Give the site a name, based on place names or other features on the Ordnance Survey 1:50 000 or 1:25 000 maps, eg. East bank of River Nethy; Road verge B970, etc.
- Please say which of the two vice-counties the record was from (see map above).
- When? The full date: day, month and year.
- Who? The name of the recorder(s). If someone else confirmed or made the identification, please give their name as well.

The four “Ws” – What? Where? When? and Who? are the basic requirements of a plant record. In addition, a count of plants, or estimate of abundance or extent, would be very useful. Again this is most useful for the scarcer or more notable species. Add anything else you might want to say about a record as a comment. All records are useful, and will be incorporated into the county and national BSBI databases, and forwarded onto the North East Scotland Biological Records Centre [www.nesbrec.org.uk](http://www.nesbrec.org.uk).
